Course Description:

This course focuses on fundamentals, techniques, musicality, and other supplemental skills necessary to create and maintain a successful career in horn and the music field. At the beginning of the semester, both the student and the instructor will define short and long-term goals. Weekly assignments will be tailored to these goals. Individual practice and preparation for each class meeting is required and essential for student's success in lessons, studio class, and UTEP large ensembles.

Course Objectives:

- Demonstrate knowledge of horn repertoire, including etudes, solos, chamber works, large ensemble works, and excerpts.
- Demonstrate knowledge of tone, rhythm, scales, intonation, and sight-reading
- Develop a daily routine that includes all technical areas involved in horn performance
- Become comfortable with performing and auditioning

Lessons:

Individualized lesson times will be scheduled during the first week of the semester.

Students will receive at least 12 lessons per semester. In the event that a student needs to cancel a lesson, the instructor must be given at least 24 hours of advance notice by email. It is the student's responsibility, not the instructor's, to reschedule a lesson cancelled by the student. If the lesson is not rescheduled, the absence will be considered unexcused and will negatively impact the student's grade. If the instructor must miss a lesson, the student will be notified and the lesson rescheduled in advance.

Students should arrive to lessons warmed-up and prepared.

Horn Recital/Special Event Attendance:

Each semester, there will be events where attendance is mandatory. If you are unable to attend due to an unavoidable conflict, you must notify Dr. Simmons at least one week prior to the event to discuss alternative assignments. Attendance will be taken by the TA or other designated person.

Studio Class Participation:

Horn Studio Class/Horn Choir will be held on Fridays from 3:00- 4:30 pm. If you have a conflict, please email Dr. Simmons. All students will be required to perform at least once each semester.

Scale Proficiencies:

All undergraduate students will be required to perform scale proficiencies each semester. Proficiencies must be completed by the next to last lesson of the semester. Students wishing to complete their proficiency prior to this lesson may contact Dr. Simmons.

The following are suggested proficiencies; the instructor reserves the right to modify these to meet the student's particular needs.

First Semester: All Major Scales and Chromatic

Second Semester: Harmonic Minor Scales

Third Semester: Melodic Minor Scales

Fourth- Sixth Semesters: All Major Scales, Minor Scales, and Full Range Chromatic

Jury/Final Exam

A student's jury will act as the student's final exam for the semester. Repertoire for the jury will be chosen with the instructor at the beginning of the semester. This jury is presented to the brass faculty or the applied teacher and teaching assistants at the end of each semester. Every student is required to present a jury, unless they have presented a solo recital that semester, or at the discretion of the instructor. If the jury requires piano, the student is responsible for scheduling rehearsals with their pianist prior to their jury.
