Course Objectives:

- Students will understand the basic knowledge of theatre.
- Students will develop the understanding of the aesthetic of the performing arts and theatre as an art form and its role in society.
- Students will be able to evaluate and present a critical view of social and cultural influences of productions that they view online.

Teaching Philosophy

My teaching philosophy is to allow students to experience personal responsibility in a university setting. It will be the student's responsibility to actively participate in their job as a college student by actively participating in the online class several times over the course of the week, checking blackboard daily, being prepared for and completing all assignments and test. My job is to provide a positive environment that encourages the desire to learn, guide the students through the course and make sure that the students feel comfortable coming to me to ask any questions or to talk about the class.

Class Attendance

This is an online class that is 4 weeks long. Your participation in class is almost daily, depending on how you manage your time.

Exams

Participation

• Because this is an online class participation is critical. You will have an introduction module to prepare for class, that work is part of your participation. Every module as a closing thought discussion and that will be go into that grade. Lastly, I will be assigning you a grade on your participation; I will look on online presence, completion of work done in an on time matter, your communication with me, etc.

Module Work

- There are 4 modules in this class. Each module will contain various learning components and assignments. You will have journals, discussion boards, quizlets, etc.
- Each module will be worth 10% of your final grade.

Play Review

• You will watch *A Doll's House* on Digital Theatre Plus and using all the information you have learned this semester you will write a well-structured review of the production. Instructions and a Rubric will be provided on Blackboard.

Extra Credit

Because this is an online class, extra credit is not possible. But I do offer some bonus points here and there for those students who go above and beyond on their discussion boards. So post early, post well and do follow-up.

Late Work

I do not accept late work! No Excuses Allowed! This class moves too fast to fall behind. Once you miss a deadline you need to just move forward and not let it happen again.

Get out of Jail Free Card

I allow every student one (1) "Get out of Jail Free Card" – This is your opportunity to save yourself in the event you have a computer crash. You can only use it on **EXAMS.** You simply email me (via our blackboard shell – not UTEP.edu) the instant it happens explaining the situation, your email should be written in proper format, proper subject and be written in a nice and polite tone because you are asking a favor from me. Once submitted and I process the request you cannot use it again, even if you miss the window I have opened for you (usually 24 hours-36 hours from processing). If your computer crashes at 11:55pm on due date, I expect to see email by 8am the next day. You cannot request after that time has passed. This is not for those who just forget to do the assignment it is only for technical difficulties.
