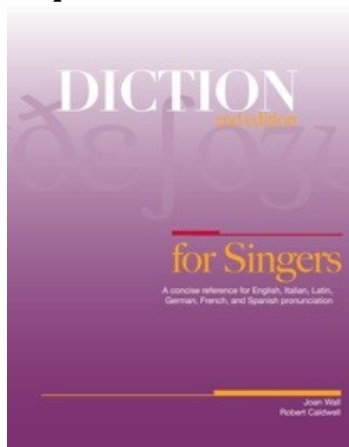

Course Description

The study of the International Phonetic Alphabet applied to English, Italian, Spanish, and Latin song repertoire. The students will learn how to read and write the IPA symbols in these languages as well as be able to pronounce and sing accurately in them through drill and practice.

Course Content

Students will learn the importance of accurate pronunciation in the different languages. They will get familiar with the specific sounds and articulation in all of these as well as the appropriate use of IPA and its rules.

Students will learn the different IPA symbols and rules used in these languages to be able to write the IPA translation, and apply them to singing.

- Learn the IPA symbols for the different languages
- Accurately pronounce the IPA in the different languages
- Write the IPA translations of songs for the different languages
- Sing in these different languages applying the rules learned in class.
- Study a song selection in the different languages sung by native speakers.

Students will prepare and memorize four songs to sing in class along the semester covering the four different languages to be studied. They will prepare the appropriate IPA translation for each one of them. The students will get feed back from the instructor and the students in order to enhance their performance regarding pronunciation.

Course Objectives

The objectives of this course are to help the student to:

- Learn the IPA rules and symbols for the English, Italian, Spanish and Latin languages.
- Develop the skills to adequately prepare IPA translations on their own.
- Sing in the different languages with appropriate diction and articulation.
- Objectively assess their own performances and those of their peers through class discussion regarding accurate pronunciation and rule application in the different languages.
- Immerse the student in the language by studying a playlist with native speakers singing in the different languages.

Course Outcomes

At the completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- Know the IPA symbols for English, Italian, Spanish and Latin.
- Read and write accurate IPA translations for the different languages covered.
- Perform four songs from memory with accurate pronunciation.
- Constructively critique self and peers verbally regarding pronunciation in singing.
- Be familiar with some standard repertoire and native singers in the different languages covered in the course.

Course Requirements

- Attend and actively participate in all regularly scheduled class meetings.

- Learn the rules of the IPA in the covered languages.
- Complete all written and listening assignments and quizzes.
- Independently learn and memorize four songs approved by the instructor. The student will sing these songs for presentation in class and for presentation as the mid-term and final exams.
- All homework will be posted on Blackboard and submitted electronically through your assigned One Drive folder on the dates established by the instructor.
