Course Objectives

At the end of this course, students will be able to:

- (a) Application of integration.
- (b) Integration Techinques, L'Hopital's Rule, and Improper Integrals.
- (c) Infinite Series.

Topics

In this class you should be able to apply integrations techniques to a variety of problems related to areas and volumes. Additionally, the student must interpret symbolically integrals and to understand the appropriate technique to perform computations. The student should be able to use Taylor series to approximate functions and perform computation of values for infinite series.
