Course Description: This is the culminating clinical practicum course designated to provide participants with the opportunity to synthesize and integrate the knowledge they have acquired in advanced practice settings. In consultation with faculty and community mentors, students will select an area of clinical decision-making in the provision of culturally appropriate, patient-center, evidence-based care. Students will develop case presentations from their experiences. **Includes 360 clock hours of practicum experience**.

Course Objectives:

At the completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- 1. Develop and sustain therapeutic relationships and partnerships with identified stakeholders to facilitate positive healthcare outcomes over the continuum of care.
- 2. Critically analyze implemented evidence-based project plan and project outcomes to identify future recommendations for improvement of healthcare.
- 3. Disseminate project findings to stakeholders, external audiences and internal audiences (i.e.-university, other public venues). Complete DNP Project.
