

MUSA 2267 Secondary Instruction Woodwinds Syllabus

Course Description

This course covers instrument care, reed adjustment, embouchure, breathing techniques, fingerings, articulation, literature and teaching strategies for flute, clarinet and saxophone. Students will learn to play basic notes, scales and exercises giving the student a better understanding of how to teach these instruments when they become educators. Skills developed in this course are valuable for application to band and orchestra educators.

Course Objectives

Students will be able to:

- play notes, exercises and scales that will be required of band students
- demonstrate proper posture, embouchure, breathing, finger technique and reed care
- choose instruments, reeds and music appropriate for band students

Required Materials

- Dietz, William, ed. *Teaching Woodwinds, A Method and Resource Handbook for Music Educators*. Belmont, CA: Schirmer, 1998.
- Flute, clarinet, saxophone (available for check-out)
- At least 2 clarinet reeds
- At least 2 saxophone reeds
- Water for soaking reeds
- Note taking materials

Course Organization

This course covers the basics of the flute in the first six weeks, basics of the clarinet in the second six weeks and basics of the saxophone in the remainder of the semester. Students will have reading and practicing assignments each week. They will have at least one written quiz and one playing test on each instrument. The final exam will be written. If you miss a quiz test/exam, it **cannot** be made up. Plan accordingly.
