Course Objectives (Learning Outcomes):

The course will primarily cover chapters 1-8. Topics to be covered are: Mechanics of a single particle and a system of particles, Variational principles, Lagrange's equations, Two-body central force problem, Kinematics of rigid body motion, Small oscillations, Hamilton's equations of motion.

Grading Policy:

Grades in this course will be based on your scores on two midterm exams, a final exam (comprehensive; but with emphasis on the last part of the course), laboratory, homework assignments, and in-class participation.

1. Homework

The problem solving methods you develop in this course are critical for success in future courses. A numerical score will be assigned for each homework set. **Please do not fall behind because future material generally depends on previous material. Seek help immediately.** Please form study groups with your classmates and seek help as you attempt to solve problems. Make sure that you understand the solutions and write them up yourself!

2. Exams

You should bring with you a calculator to work out the answers to numerical problems. Cell phone use is NOT ALLOWED during the exams.

Dates of the midterm exams are listed in the course schedule at the end of the syllabus. The final exam is scheduled to take place Tuesday 12/10/2019 from 10:00 am – 12:45 pm.

The best way to prepare for the exams is to work out the assigned homework problems regularly. You should work as many additional problems from the text as you can: this is the best way to ensure your understanding of the material.
