General Information

Description

This class will introduce you to the discipline of political science. You will learn some of the basic methods of the social sciences (this includes a review of basic statistics). The topics will include political theory, comparative politics, and international relations. In essence, you will learn the basics of how to think like a political scientist in their various subfields.

This class has a political economy flavor to it. These parts will be scattered throughout all of the class topics. You will learn such concepts such as collective action problems, Pareto efficiency, and other related topics. You may be surprised that political scientists use math to analyze the political world. However, I will always keep the formal theory topics I teach you very simple and easy to understand at an undergraduate level.

Course Goals

After the completion of this course, students should have the following skills or knowledge:

- Have a basic understanding of social scientific principles.
- Have a comprehension of major concepts and principles of political science.
- Have some foundation to analyze politics in an objective manner.

Course Details

Quizzes

There will be two midterms. The first midterm will cover material since the beginning of class up until then. The second midterm will cover the material since the first midterm until then. Final

The final is comprehensive. However, the material covered since the second midterm will be emphasized. The final will need to be completed at 11:59pm on the day it is due.

Class Lectures

The class is all online. The lectures will be prerecorded and uploaded to Blackboard. You may watch them at your leisure—the class is asynchronous. But you will need to watch them before you take the quizzes, midterms, and final if these tests ask you about material in them.
