Course Objectives  
(Learning Outcomes): This course is the second part of the calculus sequence. In Calculus I, you were introduced to the three fundamental notions upon which calculus is built: limits, derivatives, and integrals. Our main objectives of this course are

1. to deepen the comprehension of these notions through conceptual discussions and the investigation of many problems and applications.
2. to master more advanced methods and techniques, and apply them to the solution of a variety of problems.
