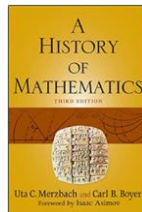

Course Content: The student will investigate the history of Mathematics from Renaissance until modern times. The material will include historical information as well as investigating problems associated with various epochs of history. Students will be required to solve problems as well as learn history.

Homework Assignments: You will have a mix of discussion boards (after discussion in class) and problems to make the 20 points for each of the ten weeks we have an assignment. You will work on these assignments through group discussion with a final draft for each student (individually) due at the end of the week. Class will frequently involve group work; however, we will always have health and safety in mind as we do so.
